

MINUTES OF THE MEETING TAKEN BY CHIEF SECRETARY, ODISHA IN THE MATTER OF ESTABLISHMENT OF INSTITUTE FOR TRAINING OF TRAINERS (ITOT) IN THE STATE

The meeting on establishment of State of Art Institute for Training of Trainers (ITOT) was taken by the Chief Secretary, Odisha on 2nd April, 2012 at 12.30 p.m. in the Conference Hall of Chief Secretary. The following officers were present in the meeting:

1. Development Commissioner-cum-Additional Chief Secretary, Odisha
2. Principal Secretary, Finance Department
3. Principal Secretary, MSME Department
4. Commissioner-cum-Secretary, E&TE&T Deptt. & Commissioner-cum-Director, DTE&T, Odisha
5. Joint Secretary to Government, E&TE&T Department
6. General manager, CTTC, Bhubaneswar
7. Manager, CIPET, Bhubaneswar

At the outset, the Commissioner-cum-Secretary, E&TE&T Department, Odisha highlighted the need for establishment of a state of art institute for training of trainers of the existing ITIs/Polytechnics as well as upcoming new institutes, advanced employable skill training for the trained youths to make them industry ready and skill up-gradation training of industrial workers for improving their productivity. He further mentioned that, the State has the target to train about one million people during the 12th Five Year Plan for which there is absolute necessity for creating a talented pool of trainers in the State. The matter was discussed in threadbare and following decisions were taken:

1. The standard list of modern tools, equipment and machineries for different NCVT affiliated trades shall be prepared as per NCVT norm with detailed specifications and make those binding on all Government and Private ITIs to ensure quality craftsman training.
2. Instructor's Training Wing sanctioned under World Bank assisted Vocational Training Improvement Project at ITI, Talcher with an investment of ₹ 3.5 crore needs to be expedited.
3. Proposal for up-gradation of model ITI, Chowdar under GoI/MoLE to the status of Institute of Training of Trainers needs to be expedited.

4. Establishment of Advanced Training Institute in PPP mode at Jatni through viable gap funding of GoI/MoLE needs to be expedited.
5. CIPET, Bhubaneswar will optimally utilize 8 acres of IDCO land allotted to them at Balasore for establishment of Advanced Plastic Processing Training Centers and Skill Development Centre (SDC) in plastic and allied skill sectors with annual training capacity of 500 youths. The requirement for extra land for establishment of Skill Development Centre will be justifiably proposed by CIPET for skilling 1000 persons annually.
6. CTTC, Bhubaneswar will take necessary measures for establishment of a State of Art Institute. The CTTC, Bhubaneswar will submit a DPR in this regard for skilling at least 1000 persons annually for further necessary action at Government level.
7. Government in principle intends to set up a State of Art Institute of Training of Trainers Centre which will impart training to the trainers and also provide bridge courses to the ITI pass out students and also impart skill trainings in various trades to at least 2000 numbers of trainees. In this regard, first a knowledge partner is to be selected. The General Manager, CTTC informed that Karnataka Government has already set up a skill Development Centre in consultation with German Multi Skill Development Centre which is similar to this concept. Chief Secretary desired that Commissioner-cum-Secretary, E&TE&T should visit for a discussion with Karnataka authorities in this regard for further necessary action at Government level.
